Dear Parents,

I was so proud of our students when I received our ITBS test results. We had set a goal of raising the composite class average by 5 percentage points. Last week I was able to announce that, not only had we met our goal, we had raised the class average by 8 percentage points.

Our 2nd through 8th graders take the Iowa Test of Basic Skills each Fall, which is a very challenging standardized test that is given to students across the nation, both in public and private schools. The composite scores for each class have always been above average even though we suspected that not all students understood the importance of the test and may not have been putting forth the maximum effort. This year we presented the students with a motivational plan to ensure that all students would try their best. The plan included a pre-test week rally, more intensive review, incentives which included all the teachers and staff wearing blue hair for a day. Last Thursday the faculty, staff, and I were happy to deliver on our promise of wearing blue hair. We also treated the students to the spectacle of trying to set a record for the number of teachers that could fit into a VW bug. (18!)

The teachers use the ITBS scores to plan curriculum and to help them determine which students need extra support or challenge which is why the tests are administered in the fall rather than spring. Your individual child's score will be shared with you during your conference, which is being scheduled for the week after Thanksgiving.

Soon we will celebrate Halloween. The day after Halloween is the feast of All Saints. The scripture reading for this Holy Day is always the Beatitudes. In that spirit, I offer these *Beatitudes for Parents* which were published recently in *Catholic Digest*.

*Blessed are those parents who make their peace with spilled milk and with mud
For such is the kingdom of childhood.*

*Blessed is the parent who engages not in the comparison of his child with others,
For precious unto each is the rhythm of a child's growth.*

*Blessed are the fathers and mothers who have learned laughter,

*Blessed and wise are those parents who understand the goodness of time,

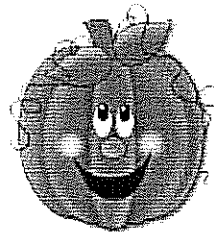

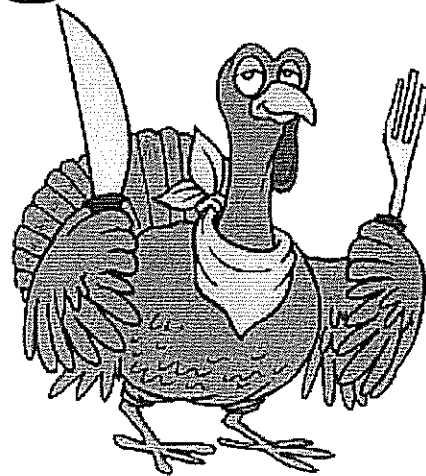

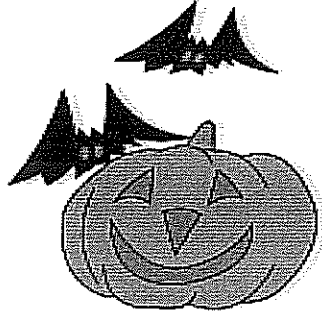
